### 3. COURSE DESCRIPTION

3.1. Course Objectives	The objective of the course <i>Italian Language 1</i> is the development of basic language and communication skills, the acquisitions of grammatical material and training structures, and the acquisition of language skills that include understanding of written and verbal interactions, verbal and written expressions, and completion of all given materials at the A1 level according to the instructions of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). Furthermore, students will be acquainted with the most relevant Italian-speaking media and basic professional vocabulary.
3.2. Enrolment Criteria	There are no requirements for enrolment.
