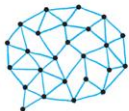

Course Objectives	The aim of the course <i>Spanish language 3</i> is to develop basic language and communication competences, to acquire grammatical knowledge and to practice structures and to acquire language skills that include understanding of written and spoken materials, interaction and oral and written expression at A1 level according to the guidelines of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages. Furthermore, students will be familiarised with the most relevant Spanish language media and basic vocabulary.
