### 1. How to apply?

After being nominated by their home institution, students must send the following documents:

- Europass format CV (English)
- Learning Agreement proposal containing planned courses
- Transcript of Records and Certificate of Enrolment
- Photocopy of passport (first page with photo and personal information)

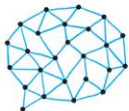

**Please note:** The carrying out of courses in English depends on the number of interested students to attend the specific course. If there is insufficient interest for the course to be carried out in English in a class, foreign students have the option of completing the course by means of individual consultations with professors, as well as the possibility of writing exams, preparing presentations, seminars, as well as conducting all other obligations in English.

### 4. Entering Croatia – Visa and Residence Permit

EU/EEA citizens may enter Croatia with a valid ID card (or passport) and then need to register with the Central Police Station if staying for more than 3 months to regulate their residence permit.

Citizens of the USA, Australia, Canada, etc. (for full list visit the website of the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs - <http://www.mvep.hr/en/>) may enter Croatia with a valid passport and then apply for a residence permit in Zagreb. Check with the Croatian embassy in your country of residence what documentation will be required for your application in Zagreb and make sure you have it with you when coming to Zagreb.

NON-EU/EEA citizens coming from a country that has a visa regime with the Republic Croatia need to apply for a visa via the Croatian embassy in their home country before departing for Croatia.

Visas CANNOT be applied for or extended in Croatia! Please contact the Croatian embassy in your country of residence for more information. You will receive an acceptance letter that covers some of the documentation needed for your visa application as soon as your complete application has been approved by your host – the Edward Bernays College of Communication Management.



In order to regulate the residence permit students need to submit the following documents:

1. Form1a, [http://www.mup.hr/UserDocsImages/Dokumenti/stranci/Obrazac\\_1a.pdf](http://www.mup.hr/UserDocsImages/Dokumenti/stranci/Obrazac_1a.pdf)
2. Acceptance letter from the Edward Bernays College of Communication Management stating the purpose of your stay (in Croatian)
3. 1 photo in colour (35x45mm)
4. Photocopy of passport
5. Proof of health insurance
6. Proof of sufficient means of subsistence (bank account statement, scholarship confirmation or similar)  
– 1000HRK (approx. 120EUR min./month)
7. Proof of secured accommodation – in case of private accommodation, a rental contract and proof of ownership (to be submitted within 72 hours upon your arrival)

**NOTE: All documents need to be translated into Croatian and certified by a notary public. Students in private accommodation should regulate their permit within 72 hours upon arrival. Documents need to be submitted at the Central Police Station in Petrinjska 30, HR-10000 Zagreb.**

## 5. Health insurance

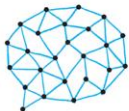
All exchange students must have health insurance during their stay in Croatia.

All EU/EAA students must possess a valid European Health Insurance Card while studying in Croatia.

All non-EU/EAA exchange students are required to register for Croatian Health Insurance upon arrival. Croatian Health Insurance is currently being offered for around 400HRK/month (approx. 54EUR) and entitles the user to full healthcare coverage. This insurance will not cover your journey to Zagreb – for this reason, please make sure to purchase travel insurance.

## 6. Arrival & Accommodation

Upon arrival, you should contact the Head of the Centre for International Cooperation, who will provide you with further instructions. A Welcome Day will be organised where you will be introduced to your mentor.



Erasmus students are required to make private accommodation arrangements on their own, although the Edward Bernays College of Communication Management will assist students with accommodation upon request.

**Average cost** for a single room is around 160.00 Euros and for an apartment is up to 350.00 Euros per month.

The landlord is required to register you at the Tourist Board/Central Police office and give you a certification of registration.

## 7. Where to eat / Student Restaurants & Prices

Students in Zagreb can eat at any of the 12 student restaurants. The largest student restaurant is located in the Student Centre Savska 25. The full price of the daily menu is 22.60HRK (~3EUR); however, students that receive a subsidy on their student card pay 6.50 HRK (~0,9EUR).

## 8. Fees & Living Costs

The official currency of the Republic of Croatia is the Kuna (1 Kuna = 100 Lipa; 1EUR ~ 7.35HRK).

The following table shows the approximate monthly cost of living for an international student in Zagreb. These prices are average values and should be regarded as a guideline only.

<b>Accommodation</b>	From <b>€160 to €350</b> (+ utilities such as electricity, water, heating)
<b>Food</b>	Approximately <b>€60</b>
<b>Transport</b>	<b>€13.5</b> (public bus & tram)
<b>Books</b>	Course-related literature will be available in the library of Edward Bernays University College
